UAL Arts Widening Participation Programme – Afterall Research Internship

Two days per week (Wednesday and Friday, 10am–6pm) for six months, £10.50/hour

About Afterall: Afterall is a Research Centre of University of the Arts London, located at Central Saint Martins. It is a non-profit organisation that undertakes contemporary art research within this academic framework, and in partnership with other international educational and cultural institutions.

Afterall is a journal of art, context and enquiry, which offers in-depth analysis of artists' work, along with essays that broaden the context in which to understand it. *Afterall Online* continues the lines of enquiry explored through the journal.

Afterall Books has three strands of publications: 1) *One Work*, a library of small books, each title focusing on one important work of contemporary art through a single text; 2) *Exhibition Histories*, a series examining exhibitions that have shaped the way contemporary art is experienced, made and discussed; and 3) a series of *Critical Readers* looking at significant areas of modern and contemporary art practice through the commissioning and reprinting of a collection of key texts.

Internship opportunity: The Afterall research internship would offer you the opportunity to discuss contemporary art with Afterall's editorial team, gain research experience and insight into the publishing process.

Your role at Afterall: As an Afterall intern, your role will be essential in supporting the Editors. Your internship will be supervised by Beth Bramich, Research Coordinator, and Louis Hartnoll, Assistant Editor.

Your tasks will include:

- Researching artists, relevant topics and authors in preparation for editorial meetings
- Researching images, and securing their reproduction rights
- Drafting picture captions and picture credits
- Publishing texts on the Afterall website
- Assisting in the organisation of Afterall events and generally supporting the office

About you: This position would be perfect for someone who is interested in contemporary art, critical writing and arts publishing. We are looking for a self-motivated individual with strong communication skills and high attention to detail. Administrative experience or an interest in online publishing would be an advantage.

The AWP internships have been funded to provide opportunities for students who do not have access to advice and support from a parent who is a University graduate.
